Yes we can...

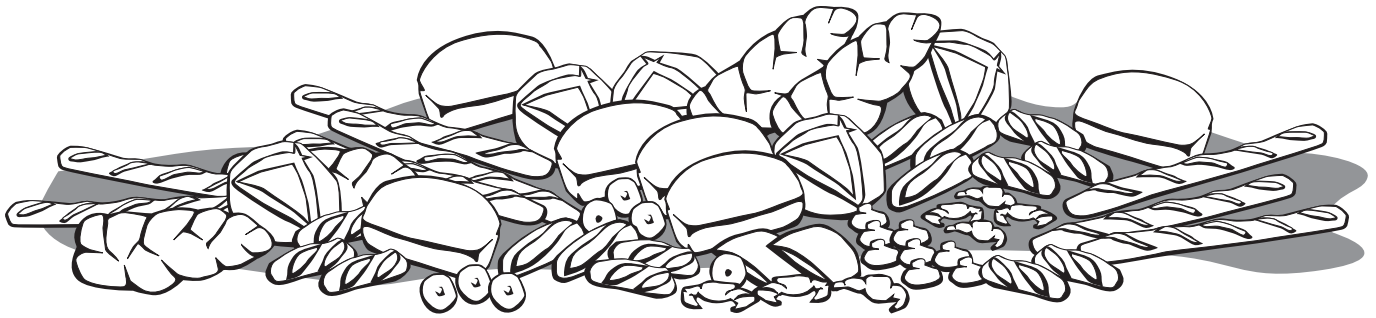
